Group of attorneys and judges created a committee called PLIC. They are hoping to partner with community colleges to offer 3 educational pathways:

- 1. The 2 year degree program (PCC and UCC already have these in place) in which they meet the minimum competencies required plus documented hours of work experience.
- 2. A verification process for incumbent paralegals to get approved through a competency based assessment of some type plus 20 hours of Continuing Legal Education (CLE) to meet the required competencies (this is the part I think we can help with) for licensure.
- 3. Continuing Education needed to maintain the license (could be a follow up later)

This would be a license program (not certificate) that paralegals are moving towards as next level of paralegal duties like representing lower income families and tenant laws. Paralegal would work with a firm or can be self-employed. SBDC would help create a pathway for business ownership.

If it is approved, we would then follow up with this subcommittee and develop the work. Each institution could support their local students.

Questions to answer:

- 1. How can community colleges help to create a pathway?
- 2. What trainings can community colleges offer?
- 3. Credit requirements?
- 4. Is there a non-credit options?
- 5. Who would teach classes?
- 6. Who would pay the fee? Student or firm or scholarship opportunity? What would the cost be?

Next Steps:

Response is needed from this group by next Monday (Oct 18th). We will work with Linda Odermolt who is working on the project from the Oregon state bar. Framework will be taken by PLIC committee to be approved by Oregon Bar and Supreme Court.
